No more equivalencies! All early childhood educators have bridging plans, funding and workplace support to begin educational upgrading.



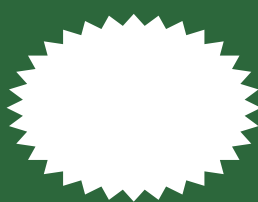
Legislating

All early childhood educators have at least a one-year certificate in the field. Wages reflect ECEs' education, experience and value to society.



Ethics

A code of ethics and standards of practice for early childhood educators have been in place for several years.



Association

Early childhood educators are members of a professional association that represents their interests.
